



DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present herewith their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2015.

Statement of directors' responsibilities

The directors are responsible for preparing the directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with Irish law.

Irish law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year that give a true and fair view of the company's assets, liabilities and financial position as at the end of the financial year and of the profit or loss of the company for the financial year. Under that law the directors have prepared the financial statements in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in Ireland (accounting standards issued by the Financial Reporting Council of the UK, including Financial Reporting Standard 102, applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland and promulgated by the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Ireland and Irish law).

Under Irish law, the directors shall not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the company's assets, liabilities and financial position as at the end of the financial year and the profit or loss of the company for the financial year.

In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and identify the standards in question, subject to any material departures from those standards being disclosed and explained in the notes to the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to:

- correctly record and explain the transactions of the company;
- enable, at any time, the assets, liabilities, financial position and profit or loss of the company to be determined with reasonable accuracy; and
- enable the directors to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2014 and enable those financial statements to be audited.

The directors are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Accounting records

The measures taken by the directors to secure compliance with the company's obligation to keep adequate accounting records are the use of appropriate systems and procedures and employment of competent persons. The accounting records are kept at the registered office at 65 Terenure Road West, Dublin 6W, Ireland.

Principal activities and review of the business

The principal activity of the company is to hold investments and other assets in trust for the Religious Congregation known as the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart.

Profits, dividends and reserves

The company did not reserve any income, or record any expenditure in the year. The company remains dormant in the current financial year and consequently there were no transactions in either the current or previous financial year.

Business review and future developments

The state of affairs of the company is considered by the directors to be satisfactory.

Report on the financial statements

Our opinion

In our opinion, Missionaries of the Sacred Heart Education Trust's financial statements (the "financial statements"):

What we have audited

The financial statements comprise:

- the balance sheet as at 31 December 2015;
- the profit and loss account for the year then ended;
- the statement of changes in equity; and
- the notes to the financial statements, which include a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

The financial reporting framework that has been applied in the preparation of the financial statements is Irish law and accounting standards issued by the Financial Reporting Council and promulgated by the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Ireland (Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in Ireland) including FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland".

In applying the financial reporting framework, the directors have made a number of subjective judgements, for example in respect of significant accounting estimates. In making such estimates, they have made assumptions and considered future events.

- The financial statements are in agreement with the accounting records.





NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1 General information

The Sacred Heart Missionary Education Trust has confirmed it will hold investments and other assets in trust for the Religious Congregation known as the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart.

As the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart holds the beneficial interest in all of the investments and other assets, it incurs all costs associated with the properties held in trust for it. Accordingly the directors have prepared the financial statements of the company for the year under review on the going concern basis.

These financial statements are the company's financial statements for the financial year beginning 1 January 2015 and ending 31 December 2015.

2 Statement of compliance

The entity financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis and in accordance with Irish GAAP (accounting standards issued by the Financial Reporting Council of the UK and promulgated by the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Ireland and the Companies Act 2014). The entity financial statements comply with Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2014.

3 Summary of significant accounting policies

In accordance with the exemption available under FRS 102 para. 35.10 (m), the entity, being dormant, has elected to retain its accounting policies for reported assets, liabilities and equity at the date of transition to FRS 102 until there is any change to those balances or the company undertakes any new transactions.

The significant accounting policies used in the preparation of the entity financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all financial years presented, unless otherwise stated. The company has adopted FRS 102 for the first time in these entity financial statements. Details of the transition to FRS 102 are disclosed in note 6.

(a) Basis of preparation

The entity financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

(b) Taxation

No liability to corporation tax arises by reason of the company having no taxable income and no expenditure.

4 Critical accounting judgements and estimation uncertainty

Estimates and judgements made in the process of preparing the entity financial statements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

There are no critical accounting judgements or estimates included in these financial statements.

5 Administration expenses

Expenses for auditors' remuneration and other expenses incurred in the financial years ended 31 December 2015 and 31 December 2014 were borne by The Provincial Council. None of the directors received remuneration in respect of their services to the Company in either financial year.

6 Transition to FRS 102

This is the first financial year where the company has presented financial statements complying with FRS 102. The last financial statements under Irish GAAP were for the financial year ended 31 December 2014. The company's date of transition to FRS 102 is 1 January 2014. There have been no adjustments relating to the transition to FRS 102.

7 Statement of cash flows

No statement of cash flows has been presented as the company is dormant and does not hold any bank account or cash balances.

8 Approval of financial statements

The financial statements were approved by the directors on 23/11/2016.
